- one (1) dust collector to control particulate emissions from a pesticide/fertilizer formulation process, equipped with pulse jet cleaning mechanism and polyester needlefelt singed filters having a filter area of 228.4 square metres, exhausting to the atmosphere at a maximum volumetric flow rate of 6.96 cubic metres per second through a stack having an exit diameter of 0.66 metre, extending 5.8 metres above grade;
- one (1) circular silencer installed on the fan exhaust and capable of providing the following values of Insertion-Loss in 1/1 octave frequency bands:

Centre Frequency (Hertz)	63	125	250	500	1000	2000	4000	8000
Insertion-Loss (decibel)	4	8	18	26	20	10	9	7

all in accordance with the application for a Certificate of Approval (Air) with supporting documentation submitted by Wilson Laboratories Inc., signed by Suzanne Beattie and dated September 28, 1998.

You are hereby notified that this approval is issued to you subject to the terms and conditions outlined below:

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- For the purpose of this Certificate of Approval:
 - "Act" means the Environmental Protection Act;
 - "Certificate" means this Certificate of Approval issued in accordance with Section 9 of the Act;
 - "Company" means Wilson Laboratories Inc.; *Admin. update.*
 - "Director" means any Ministry employee appointed by the Minister pursuant to Section 5 of the Act;
 - "Equipment" means the dust collector and silencer described in



documentation referred to herein, to the extent approved by this Certificate;

- (6) "Manual" means a document or set of documents that provides written instructions to staff of the Company;
- (7) "Ministry" means the Ontario Ministry of the Environment; and
- (8) "Publication NPC-205" means Ministry Publication NPC-205, "Sound Level Limits for Stationary Sources in Class 1 & 2 Areas (Urban)", October 1995.

OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

- 2. The Company shall operate and maintain the Equipment properly at all times. The Company shall, as a minimum:
 - (1) prepare, not later than three (3) months after the commencement of operation of the Equipment and update, as necessary, a Manual outlining the operating procedures and a maintenance program for the Equipment, including the frequency of inspection and replacement of the filters, the frequency of inspections and maintenance of the silencer including a schedule for periodic cleaning developed by the supplier based on operational experience;
 - (2) implement the recommendations of the operating and maintenance Manual; and
 - (3) retain, for a minimum of two (2) years from the date of their creation, all records on the maintenance, repair and inspection of the Equipment/silencer. These records shall be made available for inspection by the Ministry staff upon request.
- 3. The Company shall ensure that the noise emissions from the Equipment comply with the limits determined in accordance with Publication NPC-205.

The reasons for the imposition of these terms and conditions are as follows:

- 1. Condition No. 1 is included to define the special terms that are used throughout the Certificate.
- 2. Condition No. 2 is included to emphasize that the Equipment/silencer must be maintained and operated according to a procedure that will result in compliance with the Act, the regulations and this Certificate.
- 3. Condition No. 3 is included to provide the minimum performance requirement considered necessary to prevent an adverse effect resulting from the operation of the Equipment.

2. The grounds on which you intend to rely at the hearing in relation to each portion appealed.

The Notice should also include:

3. The name of the appellant;
4. The address of the appellant;
5. The Certificate of Approval number;
6. The date of the Certificate of Approval;
7. The name of the Director;
8. The municipality within which the works are located;

And the Notice should be signed and dated by the appellant.
